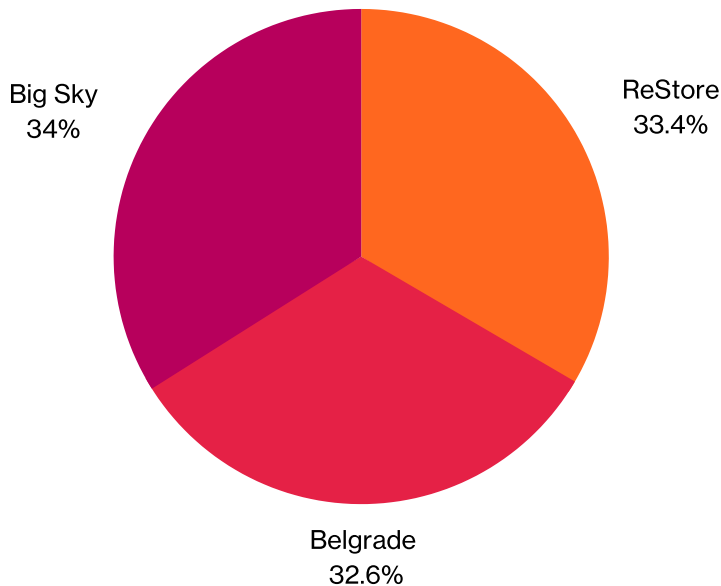
"For the first few years we were in Big Sky I found a gap in my life where Habitat should be... so the Big Sky build fills that gap." - Mel, Big Sky volunteer

Volunteers make a difference

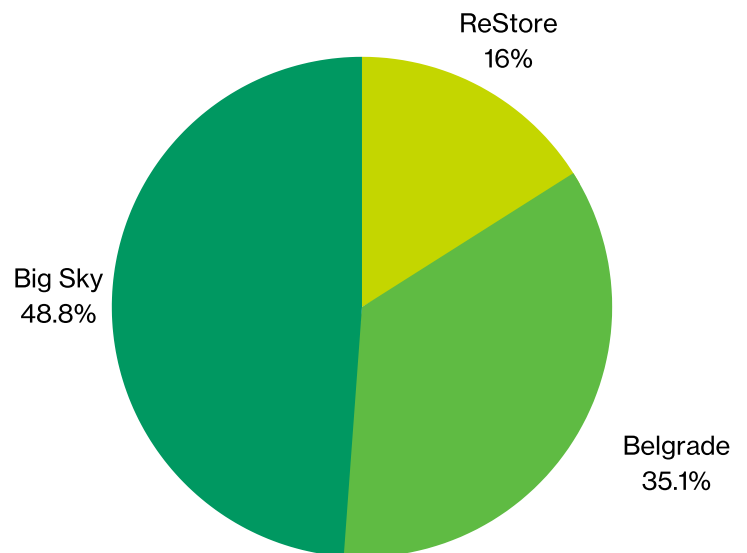
Number of Volunteers
